The Board consists of up to 20 members of diverse backgrounds and has primary responsibility for the education, character and mission of the College and for overseeing its activities, including ensuring solvency and the safeguarding of its assets. Its effectiveness is, in part, derived from it being properly representative, with a right balance and mix of skills and expertise in its members.

The Board meets 5 times each academic year and membership of a least one of its six committees is also required. Initially, prospective members will be allocated to serve on a committee as a full member in order to gain experience as a governor prior to appointment as a full member on the Board when vacancies occur.
