Vocational Skills Needed for Success

- Coursework
- Sort the bag out!
- Use of directed study time
- Planning ahead and time management

- Use of additional learning support
- Revision timetable
- Paired or group revision is so powerful



Handy hints for parents/Guardians on helping A2 vocational learners succeed.

- Manage commitments including P/T work or demanding hobbies.
- Do not book holidays or all "surprise holidays" during term time.
- Monitor attendance and authorise genuine absences.
- Promote a positive morning routine. Ensure awake and ready in time.
- Do file checks. Ask them to explain what they are studying and how it is organised in their files.
- Check they have essential stationary throughout the year
- Where possible ensure they have a healthy breakfast.
- Contact senior tutor if you have any concerns and check CEDAR.
- Ask about placement (where learners undertake a placement) Do a practice run and ask about progress.
 - Check when exams are. Ask to see their study plan.
 - Be part of the revision process. Help with quizzing, planning etc. Do they need any resources such as revision cards or a revision book?

If needed encourage reduction in P/T work prior to exams to allow time for revision.

Encourage a good sleep routine. Not on social media in the early hours.

And, Finally...

Talk about the benefits of all of the above. Look at long term goals and aspirations.
