Next steps

- All students have now been made an offer of a place for Sept
- Offers are conditional on students satisfying the entry requirements for their chosen study programme and courses
- Courses are confirmed at enrolment once GCSE results are known
- Do contact Admissions should further advice be needed about courses or if your child wishes to change their course choice
- Deadline for a guaranteed course change is Friday 11th July.
 After this date course changes will be discussed at enrolment and may be subject to availability

Summer Induction Day

- All students are invited to a Summer Induction Day on Tuesday 1st July
 9.30 2.30pm
- Each student will follow a timetable of lessons based on the courses they wish to study in September
- This is a fantastic opportunity to meet teachers, other students starting in September and experience a day at college before enrolling in August
- Invites have been sent to students via post and they must let us know if they will be attending this day by Friday 23rd May.

Next steps

- GCSE Results are released Thursday 21st August
- Our enrolment takes place over 2 days on Thursday 21st and Friday 22nd August 2025
- Your child will be sent enrolment information in July with an appointment to enrol
 at the college on one of these days
- Parents/Guardians are welcome to attend enrolment with their child
- GCSE results are checked and courses are confirmed at enrolment
- Enrolment is a supportive process advice & guidance at every stage and curriculum teams available. Careers support available
- If you are unable to attend enrolment at the college on 21st or 22nd August please inform admissions who will make alternative arrangements for you to enrol.
