The 3 pillars of education

- **1. 'Character'** individual traits and strengths that enable someone to flourish at all stages of their lives. E.g. self-awareness, resilience
- **2. 'Knowledge'** a rigorous, rich, and stretching curriculum, with each subject or domain studied given high status and an equal emphasis. E.g. GCSE, A-levels, Degree
- **3. 'Skills'** the application of knowledge and character in real world scenarios through team work, leadership, problem-solving and communication.



Personal development: Outstanding Ofsted 2025

"Curriculum teams weave employer talks, alumni visits and workplace visits through the curriculum. Students benefit from work experience placements and work-related learning where they work on real-life tasks set by employers. Learners visit universities to explore life in a higher education setting and hear academics and employers speak about future routes and job roles. Staff make sure that students and adult learners access one to-one careers appointments with careers advisers, where they discuss their aspirations, skills, qualities and interests.

- Structured and targeted careers programme delivered to all cohorts through tutorials, events and one to one guidance
- UCAS and Employability A2 tutor groups to allow bespoke and regular input from external providers such as universities, apprenticeship providers and employers

Be Ambitious
