It's been fast moving in Music Production since half term. Our first year cohort have completed their studio proficiency unit and have been hiring out our studio to collaborate on recording projects. They have also started their DAW sequencing unit and are working towards assessment in April. Learners have complete the 'approaching a composition' project, preparing them to tackle any music making brief. This includes analysing and evaluating music purposes, sketches, sound palettes, context, narrative and composition strategies.

High achieving student, Franklin Lee-Ryan remixed Lady Gaga for our Dance students' performance show in December.

Second year learners are deep into their Analog Synthesis and Sound For Media units. Learners have been building synth patches for music, film and games. They have composed character themes, background music and created incidental sound effects to significant works. The Joker, Hunger Games and Stranger Things to name a few.

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## FORMER STUDENTS RETURN FOR MASTERCLASS

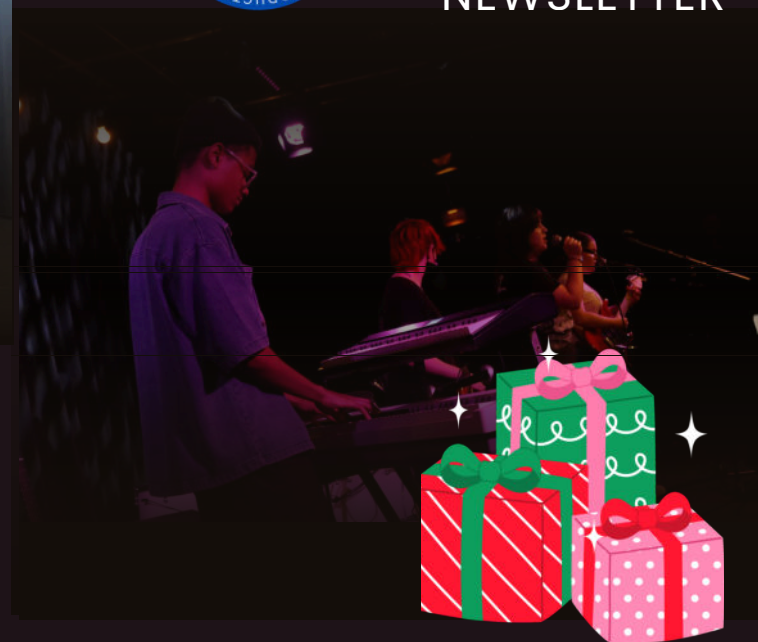
